Captains Report

2014-15 Program

This year it has been decided that the program will not be printed but will be accessible on the clubs website. In addition the competitions calendar will be printed in the putter each month whilst also being listed on the online booking sheet. If members require a hard copy they are welcome to contact me.

Changes to the program this year include the movement of our Club Championships. These will

be played around 2-3 weeks later than usual to try and ensure the course is in as good a condition as possible after the coring of the greens which occurs around this time.

The Presentation Dinner will also be altered to a lunch, working in with our annual Ham & Turkey Day. It is hoped this will mean more of the players who have won a trophy during the year are able to attend.

Booking sheet

Numbers for our weekly competitions have been very big recently with 160 players not uncommon. This means that the demand for spots on the booking sheet is high and members are reminded that:

They must only book if they intend to play. Using the booking sheet as a holding position in case you want to play is not acceptable.

If they are unable to play they must remove their name as soon as possible.

Placing your name in the booking sheet all week, only to remove it late on Friday evening is also not acceptable.

All in all the use of the booking sheet has been relatively good, but with the increase in numbers this will be actively monitored over the coming months and players are reminded that not adhering to the booking rules may result in them losing their booking rights.

One tee system

The one tee system is now back in force, whilst the time gaps have also been altered from 7 minute intervals to 8 minute intervals. This is a measure to improve the speed of play throughout the day without limiting numbers too drastically (the R&A recommends 10 minute intervals!) and will be assessed over the winter months.

I have also been asked a number of times about having a two tee system all year round. However, this is only effective in the summer months when demand for early times due to heat are high. During winter this demand drops whilst the two tee system in its current format actually DECREASES the number of players on the course - as such during high demand periods this system is even less effective.

Autumn Classic

The first Sunday in March saw the annual Autumn Classic TOURNAMENT run on a near perfect hills day. Scores were tough throughout the morning

and afternoon tee off times despite the perfect conditions, which just goes to show how difficult the course can be when played from the back markers and with some tough pin positions.

We had just under 120 players enjoy the day, golf and a meal afterwards. The best gross score for the

day and therefore the title of being our 2014 Autumn Classic champion was Anthony Evans, who shot a 75 off the stick during the morning rounds.

Congratulations
Anthony! That is a fantastic achievement given the quality of the field.

I would also encourage members to support this event in future years, not only by playing but also inviting any golfing buddies to come up and enjoy the course. It is the perfect time to promote our club but won't be successful without everyone's positivity and support for it.

There were 108 players representing 20 clubs. Minnie was lucky in the raffle, winning a bottle of wine!! Highercombe dominated the winners' circle, winning A grade (32), B grade (37) as well as longest drives and a nearest the pin. There was some confusion when Mary was called out as winner of C grade, but the winner turned out to be her playing partner from Stirling (39). Esther was our most successful player with 36 points followed by Mary with 33: they both won balls. There were also two novelty prizes: one for the first entry and the other for the neatest entry!

Naturally the Doctor asked him 'What happened to YOU?'


'Well, I was having a quiet round of golf with my wife, when at a difficult hole we both sliced our golf balls into a field of cattle.


