On Saturday, 28th April, Bill Guy scored 42 Stableford points. His score off the stick that day was 64 which is 5 under the card. Unfortunately for Bill this round would have easily been a course record, but it was a Stableford round and we are also using a temporary hole so therefore it can not be considered for a course record. This is the second time that Bill would have had a course record, but both times this has occurred it has not been in a stroke round.



Bill's score on the day consisted of one bogey (the first, not how you would like to start), eleven pars and six birdies. He shot a 32 on the front and then followed up with another 32 on the back.

You may have thought that with a round like this that Bill's handicap would have tumbled, well it did.

His handicap went from 1.3 to 0.5 which still left him on a 1 handicap.

The following week's par round, which I am told are usually very difficult for low handicappers, saw Bill come in with a score of +1. I'm not sure what Bill had off the stick as he picked up on 2 holes during the front nine, but he did have another 32 on the back nine.

After handicaps were calculated at the completion of the day, Bill's handicap went from 0.5 to 0.3 therefore making Bill the first member of Echunga that I am aware of to officially play off a scratch handicap.

Congratulations Bill on this achievement and I presume your next goal will be to play off a positive handicap.

10 Years ago **JUNIORS DO** WELL AGAIN

Echunga has had another success at junior level winning the B1 Junior Pennant incorporating the inaugural Collyn Webb Memorial Shield. Collyn was a fantastic supporter of junior golf in both the Southern Group and the South Lakes Golf Club.

The B1 Pennant is played under Stableford conditions by a team of five with the top three scores each round counting towards the final total. Echunga was represented by a rotational team comprising club stalwarts Nick Deckert, Steve Cathie, Steve Koop and new members Oskar Bergman, Alex Dorsch and Ben Stewart.

Every member was a credit to themselves and the club. They all played strong games for the team despite the unfamiliarity of courses and everyone contributed a score during the series.

An indication of quality of their play is the fact that we led (as expected) by 5 points after the opening round at Echunga but increased the lead to 20

points at South Lakes, 27 points at Mt. Barker before finally winning by a huge 37 point margin at Ashbourne. The final total of 454 is an average of nearly 38 points, great work and mostly away from home.


