# From the President

### **Course Work**

Thank heavens that Winter is all but done. We have had the wettest Winter May to August that we have had to endure in ten years. Over 500 mm!!. However in acknowledging the amount of rain, the course has been generally remained very playable.. A lot of the credit must go to the Green keepers and Grounds Committee who have ensured in recent years that our focus to Greens and surrounds has seen a significant improvement in course condition and as we enter spring, hopefully the course will be cherry ripe as they say in the classics. A number of trees have fallen over about the course which has kept staff busy. I would also like to acknowledge the Volunteer group who have been putting in a big effort during some pretty dirty weather.

It is also very heartening to see some course improvements which have been in the pipeline for

a long time come to fruition, such as fencing along Dolman road, crossing paths, drains working and generally a course which is being presented as good as it can given the weather.

Some of the less obvious work that green keepers have been doing is over at the farm where secure fencing has been put in around the farm dam and a new pump shed installed and electrical equipment repaired. Planning is underway for improved fuel and chemical storage capability and all equipment serviced and maintained. Scarifying, coring and sanding of greens will occur a little later this month. In addition a large number of native grasses and shrubs have been strategically planted about the course.

### 15<sup>th</sup> Hole

We expect that the renovated 15<sup>th</sup> fairway and new green will be opened on September 15<sup>th</sup> on Monthly Medal Day. This has been a significant project which presented its fair share of challenges along the way. I am confident that it will become one of our signature holes and may indicate a long term path toward the continuing improving of the drainage and a feature of the original nine holes. I would like to acknowledge the efforts of all the staff, committee, sponsors and members who have contributed countless hours in making this project happen.

#### **Juniors**

How about Billy Cawthorne and Elliot Willgoose who paired up to represent the club along with Matthew Hickman and Randy Jones in the SA Foursomes Championships. They had to play 36 holes off the back markers at Kooyonga.

Billy and Elliot went on to win the best nett score by four shots from the field. A fantastic achievement for the boys and a very proud moment for the club to have the Echunga Club represented by these young men. We wish them both the best as they have both entered in the SA Country Junior Championships to be held at Lake Albert later in the month.

It should be an exciting tussle to see these guys about the course over the next few months. Billy has also been selected to represent Royal Adelaide in their Junior Vardon competition and won the Royal Adelaide Award for Vardon player with the most wins for the season, picked up the Royal Adelaide Junior Championship and lowered his handicap to 5 along the way. Also noticed out on the course this week was Christine Beasley who has progressed in leaps and bounds now representing the state in women's Golf.

I believe the **Echunga Golf Development Academy** has been an important aspect in seeing many of the members achieve real success in their games and acknowledge the help and support of members and sponsors in helping to make it happen.

**Junior Clinics** are starting up again this month and I hope to see members encourage their children and grandkids into the game by encouraging them to come along to the coaching sessions. There is more detail elsewhere in the Putter.

Put this date into your diary as it is an important night for the club. There are a number of Committee positions that are due for re election. Secretary Eric March has advised members of the positions and nomination forms are available. Nominations close on September 29<sup>th</sup> by 5pm.



How often have you:

- Played without a bucket of sand to fill the divots you create on the tee areas and the fairways?
- Played with a member who does not have a sand bucket and said nothing to him about it?
- Taken a bucket of sand for a stroll around the course and not used it until you get to the 18th fairway or the carpark?
- Lobbed onto the green and not repaired the plug mark?
- Seen plug marks on the greens or divots on the fairways and have not attempted to repair them because they were not yours?

If all players repaired the divots and plug marks as and when they see them the standard of the course will be maintained and the green keepers will be able to attend to other matters around the course.
