Foursomes Championships 2017

The 2017 Foursomes Championships will be held on Saturday 18th February (qualifying) and Saturday 25th February (finals). There has been a slight change to the format for this year, with only the top 2 qualifying for the net and gross events. Finals will also alter with the gross final held over 36 holes and the net final held over 27 holes.

Saturday 18th February. Qualifying: Top 2 gross scores and top 2 net scores will qualify for the finals.

Saturday 25th February. Finals: Gross finalists will play a 36 hole Match Play Final, off the stick. Net finalists will play a 27 hole Handicap Match Play Final

Given the competition will be played across two weekends players will need to nominate their availability to play on the 25th in order to qualify. A nomination sheet will be available when players register on the morning of the 18th

Online bookings for foursomes:

As in previous years players will be allowed to play the qualifying competition in a group of six (i.e. three pairings). The booking system only allows members to book in groups of four (i.e. two pairings) however if players wish to play in a group of six only the first four are required to be booked on the booking sheet. The remaining two can simply turn up on the day.

Alternatively, if you are a group of two and are seeking a game you may turn up in the morning and join in with any existing group of four, no online booking will be necessary. The booking sheet will be open 10 days prior (9th February) as per normal.


Online Booking System



THE EVOLUTION OF GOLF Part 1 & 2... T. Woods.

Regardless of the argument about its antecedents however, the game of golf as such is incontestably of Scottish origin.

Masses of indisputable evidence show that the Scots were the first to conceive of the idea of a hole to hole contest with each player using an individual ball and clubs, both shaped from wood. The exact date in history is not known but it is recorded that in March 1457 King James 11 of Scotland issued a decree that "the futeball and the golfe be utterly cryed downe and not be used". The decree, which James 1V renewed in 1491, was

imposed in the interests of military training. In 1502 Scotland and England entered a treaty of perpetual peace and for the next 200 years every reigning Stuart monarch of Scotland and later the UK played golf and thus set the fashion for all to pursue the game. One of the Royal devotees Mary Queen of Scots was severely criticised for playing "golf in the fields" within a few days of the death of her husband Darnley. She is often named as the first woman golfer. The first golf courses were simply open fields, unattended and the romping grounds of rabbits. Among the earliest of these was the Links of Leith, though the game may have been played earlier on the North Inch (island) of Perth where James V1 learned to play and later appointed bowmaker William Mayne to be the Royal Club Maker during all the "dayes of his lyif tyme". More about the origins of our great game and equipment we use in the next issue.

From the early 1500's golf quickly achieved the status of a national sport. The only restriction on the game was play on Sundays "in time of Sermonis", when all were required to attend church. Addicts prosecuted for breaching this ban were fined 40 shillings. That Edinburgh golfers were not the only violators of the Sabbath is shown in records of similar punishments of Sunday play at St Andrews, Perth, Stirling, Cullen, Banff and the "town of Leyth" which was the historic Leith now a seaside suburb of Edinburgh. Leith's links (the name given to grass grown seashore strips) later became the course of the world's first golf club. In 1618 a gentleman named John Knox and his followers pressed for a ban of all Sunday sport but King James V1 vetoed this and declared that after the ending of all Divine Services "our good people be not disturbed or discouraged from any lawful recreation".

From that time on groups of golfers played regularly together on their local links or inland courses. Each group, a small society dedicated to the game adopted its own unwritten and simple code of rules to suit local conditions. None was in any sense a club since they had neither office bearers nor meeting places. Thus golf remained a non competitive (except for private matches) social exercise until 1744. (more to follow in the next issue about the development of 'rules')

Quote for the disturbed golfer: A golf course is only six inches long. That's the distance between your ears!

HOOPS ON THE COURSE

Due to the increased maintenance/improvements being done to the course The Committee has decided on the following LOCAL RULE:

HOOPS...Hoops placed by the Ground staff for the protection of the course **CANNOT be moved.**

If a ball hits a hoop the stroke may be replayed without penalty.

If the hoop interferes with the player's **NORMAL** stance or swing then the ball can be lifted and dropped to the nearest point of relief within one club length without penalty.

If the hoop is in line of play it MUST NOT be moved.





Etiquette

Leave your Mark on the

Game.

There are few finer pleasures in golf than walking up to the green to search out a big, fat crater of a ball mark.

Though your technique on the approach shot was no doubt faultless, chances are you need a lesson in how to fix that ball mark properly.

Here are some do's and don't's, as followed by the folks at Garden City Golf Club on Long Island.

Do not replace the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball. It will only die and delay the healing process.

Do not pry up the centre of the depression with the repair tool— that exposes the soil and will delay the healing process.

Do not insert the repair tool and twist it. This only breaks more turf loose.

Do toss the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball

Do insert the repair tool just outside the back of the ball mark.

Pull the turf toward the centre of the hole. This stretches undamaged turf over the mark, speeding recovery. Repeat this motion on all sides of the hole.

Do gently tap the repaired area with your putter.
