Foursomes Championships

Saturday 25th February saw the finals of the Foursome Championships played on a fine, but blustery day.

Our Foursomes Championship saw Brad and Dave Spaven take on Jase Hyland and Jamie Burt in a 36 hole matchplay final.

Both pairings played solid golf over the early holes but it was the Spaven pairing who etched out an early lead with holes like the 5th, where a fantastic birdie was made from the right hand trees. The lead hovered around 2 up through the majority of the first 18 with Jase and Jamie recovering slightly, to enter the second 18 only one down. The early going on the second 18 saw Brad and Dave again take the advantage as Jase and Jamie struggled off the tee, stretching the lead to 4 through 22.

In bizarre circumstances Jase's drive on the 5th hole was long and straight, but also too hard with the club head breaking from the shaft. However, this seemed the turning point. The resulting par followed by long birdie putt falling on the 6th, saw the lead back to 2 and with more solid golf, together with some great saves it was all Jase and Jamie over the next 10 holes, not only closing the lead, but grabbing one of their own to be 2 up with 4 to play.

Not giving up the Spaven's were conceded a close putt for eagle on the 15th to get the advantage back to 1 up, which held until the final hole. Whilst it was Brad and Dave needing a win, it was Jase and Jamie who came up trumps with a fine tee shot by Jamie followed by a calm putt by Jase to make birdie and secure a 2 up victory to become our 2017 Foursome Champions, defending their title from last year.


Autumn Classic 2017 5th March 2017



THE EVOLUTION OF GOLF Part 3 ... T. Woods.

As quoted in the initial edition of this series, golf courses were simply open fields and on the earliest courses there were no separate teeing grounds. A handful of sand was excavated from the previous hole and moulded into a cone shape on which to set the ball. When the hole became too deep a new hole was started.

Much has been written concerning the rules of golf. Originally players on the course made their own rules to suit local conditions, however in 1744 "The Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers" drew up a scroll of "conditions and regulations".

Ten years later "22 noblemen and Gentlemen of St Andrews" drew up their own "Articles and Laws in Playing The Golf" which were almost identical with those of the Edinburgh Golfers. There were 13 rules in toto and they are as follows:

- (1) You must tee your ball within a club length of the hole
- (2) Your tee must be upon the ground
- (3) You are not to change the ball which you strike off the tee
- (4) You are not to remove stones, bones or any break club for the sake of playing your ball except upon the fair green and that only within a club of the ball
- (5) If your ball come among water or any watery filfth you are at liberty to take out your ball and throw it behind the hazard 6 yards at least, you may play it with any club and allow your adversary a stroke for so getting out your ball
- (6) If your ball be found anywhere touching one another you are to lift the first ball until you play the last.
- (7) At holing you are to play your ball honestly for the hole and not play upon the adversary's ball not lying in your way to the hole
- (8) If you should lose your ball by its being taken up or any other way, you are to go back to the spot where you struck and drop another ball and allow your adversary a stroke for the misfortune
- (9) No man at holing his ball is to be allowed to mark his way to the hole with his club or anything else
- (10) If a ball is stopped by any person, horse, dog or anything else the ball so stopped must be played where it lyes
- (11) If you draw your club in order to strike and proceed so far with your stroke as to bringing down your club, if then your club should break in any way it is to be accounted a stroke
- (12) He whose ball lyes furthest from the hole is obliged to play first
- (13) Neither trench, ditch, or dyke for the preservation of the links shall be accounted a hazard but the ball is to be taken out, teed and played with any iron club.

(writer's note: methinks some modern players are still playing to the above rules!)

Before you know it, one beer turned to three or four and I guess we were looking pretty good to each other.


Then she tells me she has a room at the Sheraton less than 50 steps from our table. She suggested we get some privacy while pulling me by the hand.


