The South Australian State Teams

The South Australian Men's and Women's State Teams to contest the 2017 Australian Interstate Teams Matches in Western Australia have been selected.

The Australian Interstate Teams Matches are Australia's premier Amateur Team Golf Championships, with the Men's Series being played at The Melville Glades Golf Club 9-12 May and Women's Series played at Royal Fremantle Golf Club 9-11 May 2017.

Eight male and six female players have been selected, with 22-year-old Matthew Lisk from The Grange Golf Club announced men's team captain for a second year and 17-year-old Ella Adams women's state captain for the first time.

Joining Lisk as returning players to the men's team include, last year's Junior Captain, Lachlan Barker from Glenelg Golf Club and Will Somerfield from Kooyonga who will make his third appearance.

The five players to make their debuts are; Sam Burton (Tea Tree Gully), **Billy Cawthorne (Royal Adelaide)**, Andrew Nakone Junior (The Grange), Joe Hodgson (Kooyonga) and junior state captain Jackson Kalz (Glenelg).

The Men's team will be coached by Jamie Clutterham, PGA Professional at the North Adelaide golf course and will be managed by David Brand.

'Rhodes Rules School'

No.4 Bridge in Water Hazard



Question 1:

Danny's ball comes to rest on a bridge within the margins of a water hazard. Is he permitted to ground his club when;

- a) Walking up to the ball
- b) Addressing his ball prior to making his stroke

Answer: Yes, Danny is permitted to ground his club on the bridge at any time.

A bridge is an obstruction. In a hazard, the club may touch an obstruction at address or in the backward movement for the stroke. Touching the bridge prior to address is also permissible, since an obstruction in a water hazard is not ground in the hazard. This applies even if the bridge has been declared an integral part of the course. See Decision 13-4/30.



Question 2:

Danny's ball lies within the margins of a water hazard. He plays right-handed and there is a bridge interfering with his stance and area of intended swing to the green. May he take relief without penalty from this immovable obstruction?

Answer: No, there is no relief for interference by an immovable obstruction when the player's ball lies in a water hazard or a lateral water hazard. Rule 24-2b.

Had Danny's ball been at rest **outside** the margin of the water hazard or lateral water hazard and the bridge was interfering with his stance or area of intended swing then free relief would have been available. In this situation, to take relief he must lift his ball and drop it, without penalty, within one club-length of and not nearer the hole than the **nearest** point of relief.

Primary School's Golf Event



Prior to the start of the last committee meeting the Committee were briefed on the intention of the Council by councillors, Allan Rote and Roger Irvine.

The Council is aware of the strong financial position of the EGC and acknowledged the hardwork and forsight shown by past committees in getting the club to such a

The councillors could see no likelihood of the Council ever wanting to use the current course for anything than as a Golf course.

A Register is currently being compiled by the State government of how council lands are used and it would be a very difficult process to have current usage changed. (At the very least there would need to be a great deal of Public consultation which would take place.)

All of the buildings are owned by the golf club which is a saleable asset.

No need for any changes to be made in the arrangements we already have with the Council. The golf club would have to want to change it. There are restrictions on what we can do with

the land, but there are options as long as we don't compromise the watershed problems. The Committee were heartened by what they heard and appreciated the attendance of the councillors.

History is made

On Saturday, 28th April, Bill Guy scored 42 Stableford points. Some of you may think that that's no big deal as you have scored this many or even more points than this on numerous occasions, but Bill did this off a 1 handicap. His score off the stick that day was 64 which is 5 under the card. Unfortunately for Bill this round would have easily been a course record, but it was a Stableford round



and we are also using a temporary hole so therefore it cannot be

considered for a course record. This is the second time that Bill would have had a course record, but both times this has occurred it has not been in a stroke round.

Bill's score on the day consisted of one bogey (the first, not how you would like to start), eleven pars and six birdies. He shot a 32 on the front and then followed up with another 32 on the back.

You may have thought that with a round like this that Bill's handicap would have tumbled, well it did. His handicap went from 1.3 to 0.5 which still left him on a 1 handicap.

The following week's par round, which I am told are usually very difficult for low handicappers, saw Bill come in with a score of +1. I'm not sure what Bill had off the stick as he picked up on 2 holes during the front nine, but he did have another 32 on the back nine.

After handicaps were calculated at the completion of the day, Bill's handicap went from 0.5 to 0.3 therefore making Bill the first member of Echunga that I am aware of to officially play off a scratch handicap.

THE EVOLUTION OF GOLF Part 5 ... T.Woods.

In a previous edition mention was made of the "gutta percha" ball, but no details were given as to its constituency. The term gutta percha is the name given to the juice of an evergreen tree found on the Malay Peninsular. naturally little elasticity possesses becomes pliant under high temperatures and has many commercial uses such as a covering for electric wires - being a non conductor, and is also largely used in the making of hoses, belting and other flexible goods and combined with the more elastic caoutchouc (india rubber) it is easily vulcanised.

Much has been written and discussed concerning the term "Colonel Bogey" now commonly referred to as Par and for the benefit of a local well known member of our club who just loves the game of Par, this section on the "evolution of golf" is dedicated to that gentleman.

In 1890 a Hugh Rotterham of the Coventry Golf Club devised a system of handicapping whereby every player was matched against an imaginary opponent who played perfect golf, this was based on a "ground score" for his own course, the ground score being the number of strokes the perfect golfer would take at each hole, the difference to be applied to a players gross score in future games, as a deduction if the average exceeded the ground score and an addition if it were less. club's Secretary explained the system to a friend who made the observation that the hypothetical opponent was a regular "bogey man" and so the bogey became universally known throughout the UK. One particular Club which adopted the 'bogey 'principle was the United Services Club at Gosport near Southampton, whose members as the name implies all held service rank and the then Secretary a Captain Seely-Vidal decreed that "Mr Bogey" should be given the rank of Colonel and so the term "Colonel Bogey" was born and remained as such for a number of vears but as the standard of equipment, the ability of individuals and the condition of course improved players regularly proved more than a match for "Colonel Bogey" and the system was subsequently modified to what

is now known in modern times as PAR.

THE EVOLUTION of GOLF Part 6 By T.Woods.

Another subject which is not commonly put is why a golf course generally consists of 18 holes.

For the first 50 years of organised golf, that is, the half century after the formation of the first Clubs. At that time the links course at Leith, Scotland was acknowledged as the premier course and its Committee (the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers) the games senior and most authoritative body. Committee drafted the 1st Rules of Golf and in all problems except one these were accepted by most other CLubs, the one exception being the number of holes that constituted a round of golf. The number varied from Leith's 5 holes to 25 at Montrose. Leith's 5 holes were of 414, 426, 495, and 435 yards and these were played 3 times in a round of 15 holes in all, this course was later extended by 2 holes making a total of 21 holes for a recognised round, for a long time it appeared 21 holes was the norm. However St Andrews and historic Prestwick in Western Scotland each originally had 12 holes and as the two courses grew in golfing eminence the 12 hole layout became more and more widely accepted. Because of the difference between the two sites, Prestwick was roughly circular with the 12th tee close to the 1st, 3 times round the course the 36 hole round became standard for the Club and for the first few years of the British Open which were played at Prestwick. The St Andrews 12 holes in contrast stretched in a line on a seaside strip running out to the Eden. Players hit off from beside the "home" hole and played out to the next 11 holes to the 12th making a total of 22 holes. This course wa shortened by converting their first 4 holes into 2 with players hitting off from beside the 1st and the last of these holes, and so the now standard golfing phrases of "out" and " home' were originated. St Andrews persisted with its 18 hole concept and eventually because of its universally accepted authority this was agreed to by all golfing nations and authorities. See you next edition.
