The final of the 2017 Handicap Matchplay Championships was played on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> May between Hugh Griffin and Andy Amberg. After a solid start with players recording birdies and pars over the opening holes, it was Andy that took advantage of the 12 shots he was given, making some solid pars, and grabbing a small lead of 1 up though 4 holes.

However, Hugh bounced back taking advantage of a couple of holes where he didn't have to give up a shot by making par on the 5<sup>th</sup> and birdie on the 9<sup>th</sup> for wins. With Andy having a few troubles on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> the match had suddenly swung and Hugh took a 3 hole lead into the back nine.

Andy rallied to win the 11<sup>th</sup>, but found trouble on the 13<sup>th</sup> to again drop to 3 down. A poor tee shot by Andy on 14<sup>th</sup> appeared to open the door but with a nice chip out and 3rd onto the green Andy recovered whilst Hugh hit his approach over the back. However he made a superb up and down from under the back tree to claim a half and keep the lead at 3.

With no shot given on the 15<sup>th</sup> Andy was again behind the 8 ball, but made a brilliant par, recovering from a nearly dead position in the far left rough before chipping to gimmie range for his 5. Hugh's birdie putt to win the match was left well short, but the 5 was enough to make the match dormie 3.

Both players hit nice tee shots on 16 but unfortunately Andy's second was far too long, bouncing well back under the trees behind the green. With a couple of awkward chips shots off the soft leaf litter needed to get the ball on the green, Hugh only required a 3 putt from just off the back edge of the green to bogie the hole and win the match. He needed all 3 putts, but made the required bogie making Hugh Griffin our 2017 Handicap Matchplay Champion, defeating Andy Amberg 3 & 2.

# How to play your ball when affected by the screen on 16<sup>th</sup> tee block

The treatment of the screen on the 16<sup>th</sup> tee block (when playing the 15<sup>th</sup> hole) has been raised a number of times over the last month with people not understanding how this area is treated along with the correct use of the drop zone. It is disappointing that players are not reading the signs which are posted on this screen and outline the correct treatment however I will endeavor to clarify this treatment further here. The two scenarios are:

• Ball comes to rest on the 15<sup>th</sup> tee block side of the screen

If this scenario occurs the player gets relief from the screen if it affects their swing and stance (immovable Obstruction: Rule24-2). This relief is in the form of dropping within 1 club length of the nearest point of relief, no nearer the whole. It is important to note that the player only receives relief affecting their swing and stance, not the direction of their shot, and at no time does the drop zone become an option for a player in this scenario. As such the nearest point of relief is generally only a foot or two back from the screen so that they are provided sufficient area to hit their ball sideways from the screen.

The screen contains the following sign on the 15<sup>th</sup> tee block side of the fence.



### • Ball comes to rest on the 15<sup>th</sup> green side of the screen

If this scenario occurs, and the ball is at rest within the area marked with white paint, which is essentially the lowered area containing seating and the sand bin behind the 16<sup>th</sup> tee block, then the player is entitled to use the drop zone.

The screen contains the following sign on the 15<sup>th</sup> green side of the fence.



#### Some further points on this area of the course are:

When taking a nearest point of relief ruling the nearest point may be either way, ie it may be away from the fairway. The nearest point of relief may also be WITHIN a bush or tree. However once this point is identified the player may drop within 1 club length of this point.

Relief in both scenarios is free and optional, the player may still choose to play the ball as it lies. The first scenario is also the case in regards to the screen on the 11<sup>th</sup> tee block. However as this screen does not contain a sunken area behind the tee block like the 16<sup>th</sup> there is no drop zone, players simply get relief to the nearest point if their swing or stance is affected by the screen, regardless of which side of the screen their ball is on.



## The True Rules Of Golf - Part 2 of 4

- Golfers who claim they don't cheat, also lie.
- If you're afraid a full shot might reach the green while the foursome ahead of you is still putting out, you have two options: you can immediately shank a lay-up, or you can wait until the green is clear and top a ball halfway there.
- The less skilled the player, the more likely he is to share his ideas about the golf swing.
- The inevitable result of any golf lesson is the instant elimination of the one critical unconscious motion that allowed you to compensate for all your errors.
- If it ain't broke, try changing your grip.
- It's not a gimmie if you're still away.

#### 'Rhodes Rules School'

#### No.5 The Teeing Ground



Question 1: In match play, Matt tees his ball in front of the tee markers and slices his tee shot into trees on the right of the fairway.

- a) Has Matt incurred a penalty?
- **b)** May Matt opt to take his tee shot again from within the teeing ground?
- c) Must his opponent require him to play again from within the teeing ground, without penalty?
- **d)** May his opponent ignore the fact that he played from outside the teeing ground?

#### **Answers:**

- a) No, because it is match play, Matt has not incurred any penalty.
- **b)** No, Matt does not have any choice; it is his opponent who may require that he plays his stroke again.
- c) No, Matt's opponent may require that he plays again from within the teeing ground.
- **d)** Yes, Matt's opponent may also ignore the fact that he played from outside the teeing ground and let the stroke stand.

In match play if a player, when starting a hole, plays a ball from outside the teeing ground, there is no penalty, but the opponent may immediately require the player to cancel the stroke and play a ball from within the teeing ground, Rule 11-4a.

In stroke play a competitor is penalised two strokes for playing from outside the teeing ground and must then play a ball from within the teeing ground. If the competitor makes a stroke from the next teeing ground without first correcting his mistake or, in the case of the last hole of the round, leaves the putting green without first declaring his intention to correct his mistake, he is disqualified, Rule 11-4b



#### **Ouestion 2:**

- a) How far behind the tee markers may a player tee their ball?
- **b)** May a player stand outside of the teeing ground to play a ball within it?
- c) May a player repair any irregularity in the teeing ground before making their stroke?

#### **Answers:**

8

- **a)** Up to two club-lengths from the front of the teeing ground defined by the limits of the two teemarkers, Definition of Teeing Ground.
- **b)** Yes, Rule 11-1.
- c) Yes, players are permitted to create or eliminate irregularities of surface within the teeing ground, Rule 13-2.



## THE EVOLUTION OF GOLF Part 7 By T.Woods.

The evolution of golf - part 7 By T.O. Woods.

Australian history, some memorable holes in one, some oddities of the game plus some outstanding feats. Please note that the information given in this and other editions of the Pulse only extends up to and including 1971.

History shows that a Scot, Mr Alex Reid, was said to be playing a feathery around a cleared farmland at Ratho Bothwell Tasmania in the 1820's with a few friends who shared his small supply of clubs and balls. Interestingly this area is now part of the Bothwell Golf Club which is still in operation. Ratho is some 60 kms from Hobart and the club is recognised as the oldest surveyed course in Australia.

Another Scot, the Hon James Graham, was instrumental in the formation of a club laid out at Flagstaff Hill Melbourne. The Melbourne Golf Club (later Royal Melbourne) is now located on this site and was recognised as the first club in Australia to boast a listed membership, a properly constituted committee and a clubhouse. This was in 1891. In 1869 the then Governor of SA Sir James Ferguson began a club in Adelaide on a 9 hole course laid out near the site of the present Victoria Park race course. The club had a membership of 20 and played on Sunday afternoons. The club was disbanded in 1875 due to the members inability to cope with grazing cattle which left hoofprints on the greens and persistently devoured the flags. Some of these players broke into smaller groups and played on private courses at Gawler, Mitcham and Dulwich until the 1890's. It was at this time golf began to boom in Australia and such clubs as Royal Sydney (1893) Royal Melbourne (1891) Geelong (1892) North Adelaide (1890) and the Adelaide Golf Club (1892) which amalmagamated with Glenelg in 1896. Sydney Golf club was granted the Royal title in 1897. It is recorded that the Sydney golfers were more cunning than their SA cousins by erecting wire fences around their course and greens thus restraining the activities of grazing cattle. In Oueensland the Brisbane Golf Club was also formed in 1890 at a 9 hole course at Chelmer. Some 6 years later a full size course was established at Yeerongpilly which until 1920 was the only Brisbane metropolitan course, when the Hamilton Golf Club which eventually became the

Royal Queensland was opened. In WA the Perth Golf Club came into existence in the 1890's as a 9 hole course located on Burswood Island in the Swan River. This venue changed a number of times and was eventually granted Royal status.

Holes in one. Two people celebrated in other fields holed in one with the first golf shot they played. One being the well known English actress Gertrude Lawrence who performed the feat in America and the other was the tennis player Jaroslav Drobny who holed his shot Metropolitan in Melbourne in company with Adrian Quist. St Andrews golfer Tom Morris scored the first hole in one at the 145 yard 8th hole at Prestwick during the 1868 Open. American professional Harry Gonder hit off 1817 golf balls in succession over a period of 16 hours 25 minutes at a 160 yard Par 3 in an attempt to hole in one. He failed in the attempt but went close a few times. His 996th shot hit the pin, his 1162nd shot finished 6" short and his 1184th shot was only 3" off. His 1750th landed in the hole and bounced out, six shots later the ball popped in to the hole and out again to rest an inch away. After the 1818th shot he was so stuffed he had to His hands were blistered and his shoulders so sore he couldn't swing. American pro Cyril Wagner succeeded where Gonder had failed and holed his 805th shot. An English golfer C T Chevalier holed out 29 times between 1918 and July 1962 at holes varying in length from 135 yards to 300 yards. Harry Vardon 6 time Open winner holed in one only once during his career as did Walter Hagen. Peter Toogood of Tasmania had the first of his two holes in one when he was only 8 years old. Three Australians have holed out twice in the same round, Jim Ferrier at the 1846 San Francisco Championship, W Reddrop who holed out at Royal Park Melbourne on the 125 yard 7th and the 260 yard 9th and Allen Freedman whose two aces were at the 5th 150 yards and the 17th 170 yard at the Metropolitan Sydney on 7th August 1939. Three people are recorded as holing out in successive holes. Pro Alex Duthie at the Vancouver Country Club in 1911, American Bob Halverty at Long Beach California in 1945 and Wing Commander T R Vickers on the RAAF Chanfi course in June 1950. Father, Mother and son of Australian golfing family Jefferies have each holed in one. record is exceeded only by that of an English family named Simmonds whose all 4 members

have each holed in one. Australian born trick golfer Joe Kirkwood scored one of his holes in one when he drove a ball from the face of a watch at the 268 yard 1st hole at Cedar Rapids Iowa. The longest hole in one is by a Robert Mittera of Omaha who carted a ball 440 yards on the 10th at the Miracle Hills golf course. N S Craig of the Wagga Country Club has holed out 3 times right handed and 3 times left handed. At one time Craig was the only golfer in the world to simultaneously hold two single figure handicaps - 3 as a rightie and 1 as a leftie.

### GOLF- A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE GAME By Terry Woods

Ever since man stood erect he has been swishing a stick at some moveable object, be it a stone or a berry, and feeling the pleasure in moving it forward. This is the natural impulse from which the game of golf has evolved.

Historians have been arguing for some hundreds of years as to the origin of golf, some have claimed that golf springs from Northern Europes "Chole' OTHERS THAT THE DUTCH "Kolven" was its direct ancestor, it is a fact that both Chole and Koven club and ball games from the early 16th Century faintly resemble golf, but a Sir Walter Simpson dismisses arguments for both of them with the declaration that golf's discoverer was a Scottish shepherd who amused himself by striking a pebble with his crook into a series of rabbit scrapes.
