SOLITAIRE

Changes to our Local Rules "Hoops"

The Match Committee has decided to update our Local Rules in regards to hoops, to bring them into line with the normal rules of golf and the majority of other golf clubs. As a result the below rule will be in play, effective immediately. Members and guests are asked that if they are to move the hoops under this rule that they ensure they are replaced.

Hoops are to be treated as Movable Obstructions and relief MAY be taken in accordance with Rule 24-1.

If a ball hits a hoop it MUST be played as it lies (the shot can no longer be replayed). If the hoops are in the line of play they may be removed, but must be replaced after the shot has been taken.

The True Rules of Golf -Part 3 of 4

Non chalant putts count the same as chalant putts.

The shortest distance between any two points on a golf course is a straight line that passes directly through the center of a very large tree.

There are two kinds of bounces: unfair bounces and bounces just the way you meant to play it.

You can hit a 2-acre fairway 10% of the time, and a 2-inch branch 90% of the time.

Every time a golfer makes a birdie, he must subsequently make two triple bogeys to restore the fundamental equilibrium of the universe.

If you want to hit a 7-iron as far as Tiger Woods does, simply try to lay up just short of a water hazard.

To calculate the speed of a player's downswing, multiply the speed of his backswing by his handicap. Example: backswing 20 mph, handicap 15, downswing 300 mph.

Junior Clinics

On the 23rd of May, we held our leg of the Golf SA Primary Schools Golf series. The day was a great success with around 30 kids from local schools in the Year 6 and 7 age group attending. We began with a couple of hours coaching. The kids were split into 3 groups, and moved around three coaching stations, all getting some valuable coaching and practice in 3 main skill areas, (driving / hitting full shots, chipping / approach shots, and putting.)

The kids then had some lunch before hitting the course.... The course was set up with tee blocks at around 150m from the greens, and depending on their individual abilities and/or aspirations, they played 3, 6, or 9 holes. For the kids that played 3 or 6 holes, it can be said that they had a lot of fun, and had some good exposure to golf and to our Echunga Golf Club and that most of them will be back next year. Some of them much more serious about being competitive. Such was the case with the group that played 9 holes. There were 6 of them, all of whom attended our event last year and all determined to do well. They all impressed greatly with their attitude and their skills. All 6 played well enough to advance to the qualifying event, which was held a few weeks later on the 15th of June at Willunga Golf Club.

The event at Willunga involved kids from 3 different regions around the southern golf zone. The top 9 scores would progress to the final in Adelaide later in the year. Of our 6 kids, Mitchell Zander and Charlie Moseley from St Michaels-Hahndorf qualified 5th and 6th respectively, whilst Lane Hera-Singh and Gus Wilkins from Bridgewater PS, both narrowly missed out in 12th and 13th. Hayden Knappstein didn't fare as well, and Izzy Kelly came 4th out of 5 in the girl's event, (top 2 qualified). They are both from St Michaels. We wish our qualifiers well in the finals, and we look forward to doing it again next year.

During this time we have recruited at least 1 new junior member to our club in Lane Hera-Singh, and from what I have seen of Lane so far, he seems very keen about his golf and determined to follow in the footsteps of his inspirational next door neighbour, one Mr Billy Cawthorne! We now have a few juniors at the club who are all keen, showing some real talent, and poised to take some big steps this year and we are looking forward to

seeing them out on the course and playing competitive golf in springtime this year!

Junior clinics are still running once a month (weather permitting) and attendances are still strong.

Well it has finally arrived. The Official Opening date of our new Clubrooms.

It has been a long time since it was first discussed and it is very pleasing, both a Club & personal point of view, to see it eventuate.

'Rhodes Rules School'

No.6 Stakes Defining Margins



Question 1: In the photo above the ball is touching the red stake;

- a) Is it in the lateral water hazard?
- b) May the player remove the red stake to play his ball?
- c) If the stake is removed, is the hole in which the stake was previously located a "hole made by a greenkeeper" and thus ground under repair?

Answer 1:

- a) Yes, as part of the ball is touching the stake it is in the hazard. Definition of Lateral Water Hazard.
- b) Yes, stakes used to define the margin of or identify a (lateral) water hazard are obstructions and may be removed, providing to do so does not take unreasonable effort. Definition of (Lateral) Water Hazard.
- c) Yes. However, such a hole is in the water hazard and a player is not entitled to relief from ground under

repair in a water hazard. Decision 25/18.

Note: Whilst the Rules permit easily movable stakes to be moved, some course committees introduce a Local Rule defining them as immovable Obstructions. This is often because golfers who move them forget to replace them, or may put them back in the wrong place.



Question 2: In the photo above the ball is touching the stake;

- a) Is it out of bounds?
- b) May the player remove the white stake to play his ball?
- c) May the player stand out of bounds to play a ball that is within bounds?

Answers:

- a) No, a ball is only out of bounds when all of it lies out of bounds. Definition of Out of Bounds.
- b) No, stakes identifying out of bounds are not obstructions and are deemed to be fixed. Definition of Out of Bounds.
- c) Yes, a player may stand out of bounds to play a ball lying within

bounds. Definition of Out of Bounds.

Note: You will have seen that the Rules for water hazard stakes (yellow and red) are completely different from those for out of bounds stakes (white). It is worth reading the definitions of Water Hazards and Out of Bounds (in fact, all of the definitions) at the front to the Rules book.
