2018 – 2019 program

The 2018-19 program is on the web site now. There are some major changes to the timing of our events for next season. From the Shed

This is the first of what will be a regular column of news, views and information from the Echunga Greenkeepers.

As you are all aware, it has been a dry summer and autumn. This makes for great golf weather, but it does present some challenges for the course. Heavy reliance on irrigation in this weather can lead to salt build up, particularly on the greens. We are trying to repair some of these spots and ask you to avoid walking on any of these areas, if you can

You may have noticed us digging at the back of the 14th green and in front of the 2nd tee.

These scratchings have been trying to find the best spot to establish a turf nursery for Santa Anna Couch. We have now agreed the best spot for the nursery will be in front of the 2nd. Work on this will begin over winter.

Autumn is also time for projects. Over the next week or two you will see the commencement of drainage works on the 1st. These works will take up to 2 weeks.

Members may also be aware that we have just become the proud owners of a greens roller. This piece of equipment will improve the consistency of the greens. It is not our intention to make them lightning fast, but rather be able to present improved putting surfaces and healthier greens. Lastly a reminder to please repair pitch marks on the greens.

Course works

The committee has set out improvements to the course as its primary objective and



will continue improving the course, as money becomes available.

Members have no doubt noticed the improvement to scrub and hazards by removal of sticks and loose impediments, to make it easier to get out of the trees when a shot goes astray. The penalty is to get out of the rough, not to have to face an unplayable or waste time finding your ball.

Tuesday volunteers have made a significant contribution to the quality of the course by doing non urgent work, which the greenkeepers do not have time to do. This includes cleaning Golf Carts,

weeding and watering the gardens around the clubhouse, and collecting sticks and loose debris that is carted away to heaps to be burnt during winter.

Shrubs previously planted around the course have matured and we have removed some lower branches to improve playability.

Future works are to improve drainage by:

- 1. Install a drain from the hazard on the 1st across the fairway connecting to the culvert that goes across to the 15th. This will hopefully improve the approach to the 1st
- 2. Deepen the drain from the back of the 15th to the creek on the 16th
- 3. Dig a trench along the roadside fence of the 12th fairway, from the existing road drain.
- 4. Close the drain across the 12th fairway to reduce the amount of storm water on the fairway.
- 5. Drainage around 18th and across the start of the 10th Fairway.



Like humans and animals, plants require regular feeding throughout the year – at least once in each season.

Happy, healthy, well nourished plants are more resistant to pests, diseases, heat stress and frost.

Vegetables & Herbs: Give all your edibles a monthly dose of GOGO Juice to help them through any remaining summer heat waves – this will also encourage tasty new growth! Start preparing your garden beds for autumn & winter vegetables by reconditioning the soil with a generous 1-2 handfuls of Rocket Fuel per sq metre. Stonefruit trees need a 1-2kg application of Seamungus or Rapid Raiser after you've finished harvesting.

Natives: As the autumn rains arrive, give all natives 100g of Seamungus to help promote healthy, new autumn growth.

Lawns: If your lawn is looking a bit stressed after the summer heat, rejuvenate it with one of our seaweed rich products; either a top dress of Seamungus crumble or a fortnightly watering of GOGO Juice. HINT – clip the GOGO Juice 2ltr spray pack onto your hose for lawn application... so easy and quick!

As autumn rains arrive, now is a good time to lay turf. Prepare the soil beforehand with Seamungus Crumble – It will give the new roots of your turf the TLC they need to become established. Water new turf monthly with GOGO Juice to improve new root growth.
