# From The



Two words describe this season - bloody dry.

The Green Keepers are working flat out keeping the greens and fairways alive.

The challenge with a season like this is that you have to water grass to keep it alive, and when you water it in warm weather it keeps growing (vigorously) so there is plenty of grass to cut.

This has put a strain on the staff, machinery and the watering system, but it has led to excellent playing conditions (when it's not too hot)

If we don't see any summer rain the greens will start to show some signs of excess irrigation. (salt) They may not look as good, but the playing conditions shouldn't be effected.

The Committee has asked us to trial having one of the Green Keepers work on each Saturday morning for the next couple of months. They will mow, roll, or blow the greens, depending on the needs of the course. Your feedback to the committee on this trial will be appreciated.

Another thing we are trialing is using growth retardant on the roughs around the greens, to try and reduce their lushness and make them easier to play from. We hope this helps.

If you know of a good rain dance give it a go.....
