Our Pennant Teams are having mixed results, but three more matches to go and who knows, we should be in with a chance in several grades.


Congratulations to David Lockwood on winning the Autumn Cup.


Paddy was walking home late from the local and sees a woman in the shadows.

"Your advice was terrible," she responded.


