Our Pennant Teams are having mixed results, but three more matches to go and who knows, we should be in with a chance in several grades.

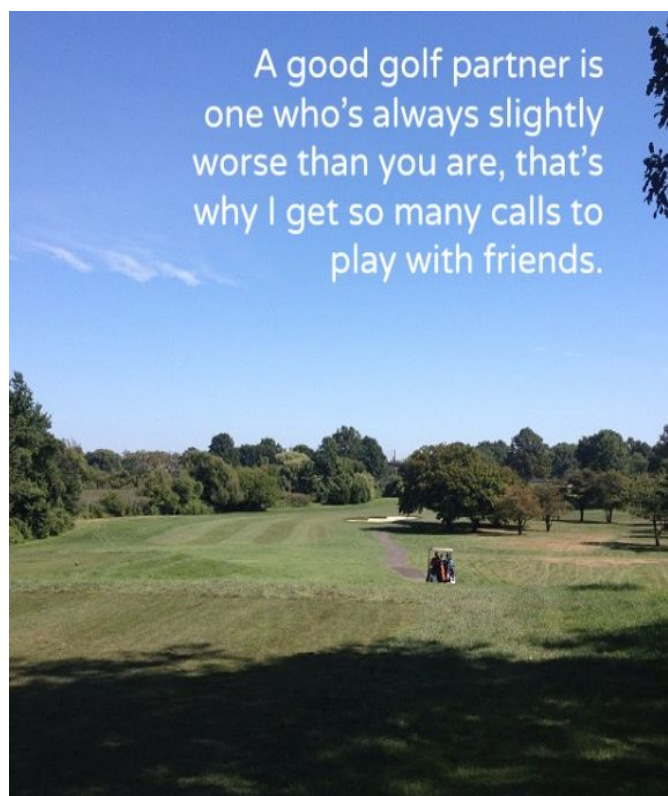
Congratulations to David Lockwood on winning the Autumn Cup.

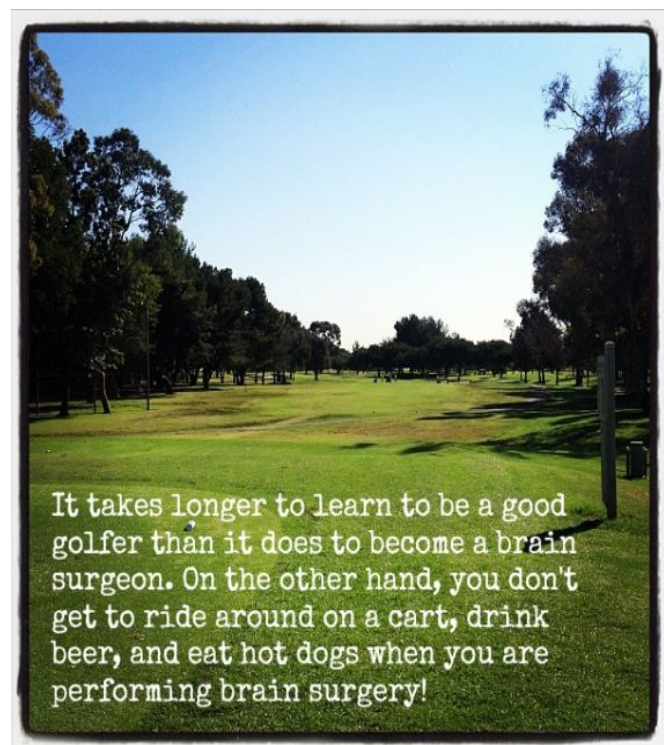
