
Thanks to the Ground Staff, both past and present for their efforts in overcoming these problems.

The Co-Pilot tells the Pilot that he probably should have the police waiting when they land to arrest this blonde woman who won't listen to reason.


The Pilot says, "You say she is a blonde? I'll handle this, I'm married to a blond, I speak blonde."
