If there are any changes to the use of carts it will be advised of the web site by 5.00pm each day.

# Club Championships 2019/2020

There appears to be some confusion re when this year's Club Championships will be held.

They have in fact been held.

In March we tried a change in programme and we ran the 2019 edition of the Club Championships while the course is at its driest and fairest and the winners were A Grade - Jase Hyland, B Grade - Nic McNicol, C Grade - Neville Jordan and D Grade - Mal Jordan.

There are several reasons for trialing the switch to March.

- It has always been a rush after winter and having the greens cored in September (which is always subject to the weather) and have the course in top condition for the championships to start in October.
- The best time to make any changes to the course is during Winter, which allows new turf to be propagated and to establish itself though Spring, prior to the hotter Summer months.
- Holding the championship in March is when the ground staff have the course in top shape for our Autumn Classic and the Women's Open Day, so whilst they present us with a great course all year, March is when our course is on show to many visitors.

So the next Club Championships will not be held until at least April 2020 subject to assessing how the shift worked for all parties.

Well winter has set in with a vengeance with the early August rains. Hopefully, the forecast dry spring will allow us to get out there again before long.

When you do get back on the course you will notice a couple of changes,

On the 10<sup>th</sup> (not the temporary hole) the staff have cut a trench from the back of the 18<sup>th</sup> towards the road to allow the water that ponds there to get away and improve the drainage of the 18<sup>th</sup>.

There is now a sleeper bridge across the 10<sup>th</sup> with GUR around it.

Members are asked to take care in this area until we get it properly established.

At the 11<sup>th</sup> tee. The Committee has decided for safety reasons to relocate the path coming from the 10<sup>th</sup> green to the 11<sup>th</sup> tee. The new path will finish on the eastern side of the tee block, while the existing path on the western side will be eventually dug up and GUR ed.

As mentioned this change is for safety reasons to get players approaching or near the 11<sup>th</sup> tee out of line of people playing the 10<sup>th</sup>



## ECHUNGA GOLFERS NATIONAL CHAMPS

Each year Spalding Australia Pty Ltd run a competition in conjunction with the Australian Golf Union called the Spalding Australian Club Team Championship and is open to all golf clubs in Australia, with the top club in each State receiving a four day weekend trip to Melbourne to take part in a play off for the National Championship at Royal Melbourne.

In 1989 the winner of the South Australian section was the Echunga Golf Club, winning by one stroke from Marino Golf Club.

The play off between the states was held recently and the four players to represent Echunga were Dean Carver, Bev Nicol, Ian Bonython and Neville Cooper.

They flew to Melbourne for the four day weekend and much to their suprise THEY WON.


The weekend consisted of three rounds of golf, a Stableford on Friday, first round of the Championship on Saturday and the final round on Sunday.

This was followed by a presentation dinner at the Royal Melbourne Golf Club.

On Monday, all the golfers were taken on a tour of the Melbourne sand belt courses.

The hospitality shown by Spalding and the Royal Melbourne Golf Club was overwhelming, with the
