

CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Handicapping

With the advent of the new handicapping system, the old allowable maximum handicap that was for Men 36 and Women 45, has now changed to be 54 for both.

It is up to each club as to what limit they put on the handicap for each competition.

As some of our older members, are at their maximum, and having a very slim chance of being competitive, as well as losing the enjoyment of golf when you cannot play to your given handicap, the Match Committee have therefore decided to increase the Men's maximum club handicap to 45.

This means there will be no changes to the club grading except for the D Grade which will go out to a handicap of 45.

The Women have increased their maximum handicap to 54.

Club Championships

The Club Championship dates for the 2020 season will be in the program for the next year and will be held in May.

Qualifying rounds will be 2nd and 9th May, Quarter Finals will be 16th May, Semi Final will be 23rd May and Finals Day will be 30th May.

Rules of Golf

Jesper Parnevik was penalized two strokes in October's Champions Tour SAS Championship.

1) Facts.

This is what happened:

- Parnevik had a short putt for a bogey.
- The putt horse-shoed around the hole... and hit his foot.
- Parnevik played the ball as it lay and holed out (for what he thought was a double-bogey).

2) The Rules of Golf.

Oops. That was wrong.

The Rules of Golf (Rule 11.1b, Exception 2) states this:

When Ball Played from Putting Green Accidentally Hits Any Person, Animal or Movable Obstruction (Including Another Ball in Motion) on Putting Green:

The stroke does not count and the original ball or another ball must be replaced on its original spot

Thus, Parnevik played from a wrong place and incurred a two-stroke penalty (Rule 14.7).

The (horse-shoeing) stroke did not count and therefore he got at triple-bogey (assuming that he did not gain a significant advantage, which is not clear from the coverage – in that case he should have corrected the error before playing from the next teeing area to avoid disqualification).

Etiquette

Leave your Mark on the Game.

There are few finer pleasures in golf than walking up to the green to search out a big, fat crater of a ball mark.

Though your technique on the approach shot was no doubt faultless, chances are you need a lesson in how to fix that ball mark properly.

Here are some do's and don'ts, as followed by the folks at Garden City Golf Club on Long Island.

Do not replace the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball. It will only die and delay the healing process.

Do not pry up the centre of the depression with the repair tool— that exposes the soil and will delay the healing process.

Do not insert the repair tool and twist it. This only breaks more turf loose.

Do toss the loose piece of turf taken out by the ball

Do insert the repair tool just outside the back of the ball mark.

Pull the turf toward the centre of the hole. This stretches undamaged turf over the mark, speeding recovery. Repeat this motion on all sides of the hole.

Do gently tap the repaired area with your putter.


