Around the Course VOLUNTEERS' REPORT

The new sand bucket rack, that replaces the wire cage on the way to the first tee, is almost finished. Hopefully, it will be more convenient and prevent damage to the buckets.

The seat on the 9th has been repaired, a large fallen tree limb on the first fairway cut up and removed and lots of sticks removed from the rough areas on most holes.

Weed eradication has taken place and tee block markers given a trim.

Preparation for the Ladies' Tree Planting exercise, by digging lots of holes, was handled ably by Pete and Graham.

Joel laid a drainage pipe down by the Ladies 6th tee and cleaning of drains is under way with lots more to do.

On-going tree maintenance of fairway borders, continues, with a professional pruning along the third, fourth, sixth and around the tenth tee block,

not to make it easier for us to reach the green, but to look after the health of the trees.

In this team there were very little absentees during the minor rounds which is great, apart from the fact that now their 7 players are the only ones eligible to play the final this week with no back ups should anyone fall ill or injured. In the **A1 division** the teams gathered at Aston Hills on yet another fine day for golf. With Lady Bay already guaranteed their place in the final, the main event of the day was between Willunga and Echunga, where the winner would become the other team to make it to the Final.

The Willunga team looked very strong on paper having a couple of Simpson cup (A1 Metro) players, in Steve Williams and Ben Layton, plus a few long standing club greats such as Scott Murray, David Pateyjohns and Paul Stanfield. The teams matched up close to how the players might be ranked with the exception of The Willunga duo of Pateyjohns and Stanfield playing 5 and 7 respectively, in the hope of securing wins against Echunga's lower order players. This tactic didn't quite pan out though, because The Echunga lower order stood up and played some amazing golf.

Elliot Willgoose, playing at number 7 took control early, intimidating Stanfield with his big driving and birdie making abilities. Elliot nearly had it won being 3 up with 4 to play, but a couple of late birdies to Stanfield and just the slightest wobble from the young 'Goose' and the match was halved.

Echunga played Naren Taverna in the number 5 match against the highly rated Pateyjohns. Naren's form hadn't been great so far in the season but Naren is a real competitor who is just coming back from a 2 year break from golf and has been building his game well over the past few weeks.

The 2018 Echunga club champ found his mojo and bewildered Pateyjohns with his renowned putting, holing putts from everywhere and producing a stunning 4/3 win.

Playing in the same group, the number 6 match saw Willunga's Matt Hage take on Viv Smith, who was coming off some disappointing performances losing his previous 2 matches. Viv turned his form around brilliantly though, and led all day to win 3/2 and tuned the game very much in Echunga's favour.

With Echunga now holding 2.5 wins, they only need 1 more with 4 matches still in progress. At Number 4, Jamie Burt was down by 1 or 2 shots for most of the day against the Willunga captain Brad Steele. In a grinding battle Jamie clawed his way back in to it and eventually took the lead making a nice birdie on the 17th hole. In the same grouping meanwhile Mike Haslett did the opposite against Willunga's Scott Murray. Mike was 3 up with 6 to play, and although he'll hate me for reporting it, there came a stunning and uncharacteristic collapse from Mike losing 5 holes in succession to lose 2/1 on the 17th hole.

It was at this point that Nathan Separovich Had won his match 3/2 against Steve Williams back on the 16th hole. Nathan is a great player who tends to come up against guys who are on fire at number 2, and so he'd only had the 1 win so far in the season and his confidence was down but this was a great win for him and for the team.

So with Jamie Burt 1 up with 1 to play, the best Willunga could do was to lose 4 matches to 3. Bill Guy and Ben Layton played the 17th hole at which point Ben was 1 up over Bill, but the game was done and dusted, so Willunga conceded the last hole to Jamie and Bill. The overall score in the end was 5/2 and Echunga are through to play against Lady Bay next Sunday at Victor Harbour for the A1 title and the Von Doussa shield.

The Echunga man coming out on top after 18 holes winning 1 up, and taking the advantage for his team leading 2/1 with three matches completed.

Big hitting isn't everything though, and someone was bound to come unstuck around the tight Victor Harbor layout. 


