#### **VOLUNTEERS' REPORT**

We have removed the Covid crosses from outside the bar entrance, hopefully they won't reappear any time soon.

Removed two "hangers" on the left of the 10<sup>th</sup> tee and cleared a lot of fallen branches, so that the mowers could get in.

Some bushes were replanted by the ladies near the 1<sup>st</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> greens. Perhaps the kangaroos were busy again pulling them out.

Branches that were overhanging the fairway edge along the left hand side of the 18<sup>th</sup> were removed so that now the mowers can cut right up to the fence. Dead branches on the big swamp oak were also taken off.

Weed control is underway in the septic square as well as on the grass mound on the south side of the carpark and the lines in the carpark have been remarked.

We helped the Groundstaff put in drains on the path to the 2<sup>nd</sup> tee. They have done a great job laying turf in what was an ugly area.

Repairs to a broken downpipe on the Clubhouse have been done and two large bushes removed from the garden to make way for some natives.

Just to keep us honest, the group had a chat to the head Groundkeeper about tasks to be done and what his plans for the course were.

A special thanks must go to the Kangarilla Earthmovers for their help in establishing the tees and greens. The irrigation system has been installed and is ready for the summer months.

I feel that with all the extensions that have been completed up to date we have managed to keep within our finances and I am still confident of having the new extensions playable the next new year.

I must also thank the Echunga Recreation Grounds Committee for their support and the Echunga Primary School for their help with the tree planting which will recommence in late October with the direct seeding of certain areas between the fairways and a larger area adjacent to the ponds.
