Thanks to Col and Bruce for their "foreman" work.

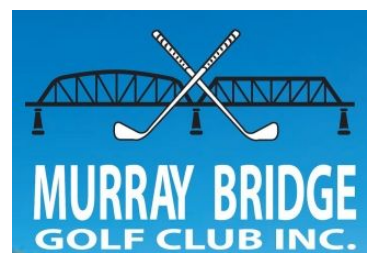
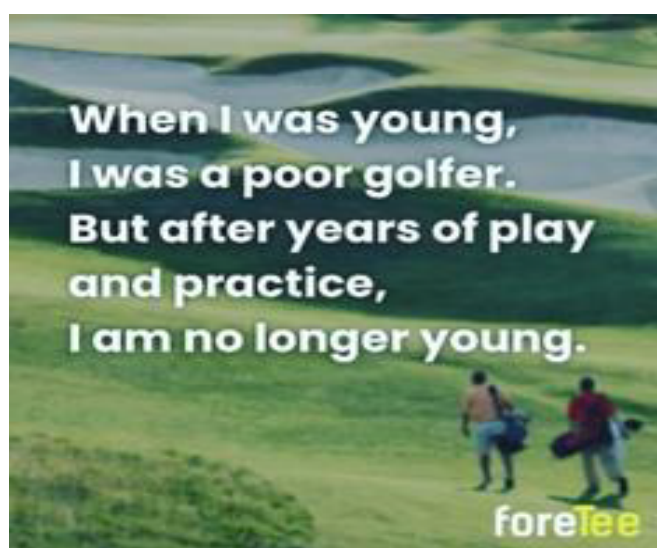
An enjoyable Christmas lunch was held to celebrate the year and to say "thanks" to all who helped with everything that we do.

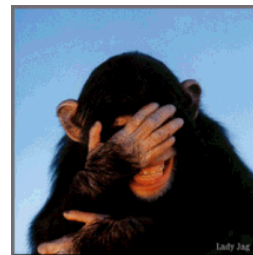
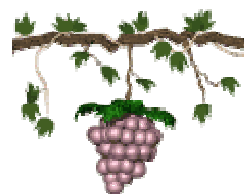
