On the putting green, if the player's removal of a loose impediment causes the ball to move, the ball is replaced without penalty. As replacement of the ball would be impossible in this case, in equity (Rule 1-4), the ball is considered to be holed with the previous stroke".

"You pretty much paid for everything – your tracksuit, the lovely white culottes we played in, a shirt and a pair of long socks.

In addition to being a State cricketer, Val was also a member of the Australian Women's cricket team and went on tour to New Zealand. This photo shows the team, beautifully turned out, doing a fairly polite Haka take-off.

Val's sporting achievements do not finish there.



Val was also a talented hockey player, with many years as a member of Adelaide Hockey Club, later known as Aroha. She (and her husband, Alan) are life members of this club and additionally, Val was made a Life Member of Hockey SA in 2017.
