



Despite this Ann won the hole and also the 6th giving her a 2-hole advantage. Each won another hole so after 9 holes Ann was 2 up.

The trees on the 10th attracted Shirley's ball once again. She did recover nicely, but not enough to win the hole. By the 13th Hole Ann was 4 up with 6 to go.

Another squared hole and then Shirley hit one of her 2 gobblers (a stroke in which the ball starts off the green and finishes in the hole) at the 14th giving her a win. Game on as she also won the 15th. Game score 2 up and 3 to go.

On the 16th both had reasonable drives. Shirley did her only less standard hit of the day so didn't get to lay up at the creek. On their 4th hits Ann's went over the creek while Shirley landed plum in the middle of the creek.

Not beaten, Shirley's next hit went past the green while Ann's landed short of the green. Then Shirley landed on the green a metre and half from the pin. Ann came onto the green 2 1/2 metres from the pin, then Ann putted near the hole and Shirley couldn't win.

The Mount Barker Council is concerned that there is only a tiny amount of remnant vegetation remaining in the district and adopted a comprehensive Biodiversity Strategy in 2020. Protecting and enhancing native vegetation and habitat in its reserves and roadsides is a big part of this Strategy.



The Echunga Golf Club recognises that it has a duty to care for the biodiversity of the course and adopted a Biodiversity Plan 2020-2025. Since then, a grant was received from the Mt. Barker Council to assist with weeding sparaxis and sweet vernal in the area each side of the path between the 8th green and the 9th tee.

Volunteers regularly work here in winter and spring on a Tuesday morning. In 2021 nearly 188 seedlings sourced from Trees for Life from local native seed bank were planted in 4 locations.


