Following widespread consultation and with the assistance of the Match Committees and the endorsement of the Main Committee. I have decided to stay with our current program structure. This means that Presentation Day will be April 6<sup>th</sup> next year (perhaps I might win something one year) and the Club Champs start on April 13<sup>th</sup> (we have allowed one extra week for catchup in case of bad weather)

The main highlights of the 24-25 season are.

### **SPRAYING REGIME**

There are several aspects to the programmes being pursued including,

- maintaining the health of greens and fairways,
- invasive weeds, grasses and bulbs which are
  of a concern in the Adelaide Hills and in
  our case are threatening our fine cut turf,
- there is a level of importance to have a
   programme that tackles invasive species
   and the recent endeavours between and
   adjacent to certain fairways seems to have
   sparked concerns from some members, but
   it should be noted this aspect incorporates a
   number of considerations including;
  - an exotic grass and weed management strategy,
  - assist in more efficient course maintenance/tidiness and.
  - an aid in flow/speed of play.

It is anticipated the visual impact of this strategy will in time, evolve into a more natural and tidier environment.

The recent introduction of the strategy is more noticeable at this time although some of the areas are already beginning to meld.

Notably, the strategy will be the subject of ongoing review which may result in a modified approach as deemed appropriate in certain areas, by the committee.

Back in business. With better weather, pruning trees on no 8, mowing around the practice nets and the grass mound in the car park.


The wind is blowing, it calls to me, do you hear it too?
