**Captain:** There was no nomination for this position.


**Vice Captain:** Randy Jones nominated and was elected unopposed.

### Mixed Pinehurst Foursomes Charity Day Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> October, 2023

Each year, a mixed Charity Day is included as part of the Women's Competition Programme. This gives us a chance to contribute to a worthwhile cause, selected by the Women's Committee, and also to invite the men of the Club to join us for a fun day.

Covid, in combination with last year's extremely wet and extended winter has meant the event has not been held for a few years.

This year we decided to contribute towards the homeless situation by supporting the Hutt St Centre. Homelessness can and does happen to anyone and we've all read stories of people we can easily identify with, who through circumstances outside their control, have finished up sleeping in their car or in the rough.

The Hutt St Centre is a place of connection and support, where people facing homelessness are empowered to rebuild their lives, rediscover their identities and reconnect with those who love them. When people walk through the Centre's doors, the priority is dealing with their immediate needs, such as, a shower, a meal or a charged phone.

A visiting service is also provided to offer medical check-ups and financial counseling. Focusing on the future, they aim to connect individuals with housing, education and employment opportunities to change their circumstances for good.

The lead up to the day was fraught, as the impending weather forecast started by showing up to 15 mm of rain, with strong winds and possible small hail.

At this time we had committed a portion of the entry fee towards platters of food. If the weather did not look to improve as we got closer to the day, we would need to cancel and possibly forfeit funds committed for the food order.

This created quite a dilemma and some stress on the part of the organisers.

In the end, we had to make the decision to cancel the catering arrangements and leave the decision about whether to proceed with the competition until the day before, with a long weekend adding extra complications.

At the last minute we decided to proceed and although there were some changes to the field, with some dropping out and some being co-opted at short notice we fielded 15 pairs.

Ben organised last minute catering, recruiting, set up the field and printed cards, as well as playing and we would like to thank him for his herculean efforts and contributions to the success of the day.

A shot gun start saw the players out hitting and the field moved very well on a course, in lovely condition, with good run.

We enjoyed watching the big hitting men and did our best to keep out of trouble.

It pays to remember in team games, that everyone is doing their best, nobody should be saying "sorry", instead the phrase is "not my problem" and you often get to play parts of the course you've never before experienced!

We did have a couple of heavy showers, but this failed to dampen the spirits of the hardy players taking part.

When all had returned to the Clubrooms we had lunch, catered by Bev Slack at very short notice. (Thanks to Pat and her helpers for setting up the tables the previous day, with our photographic tablemats showing views around the course). Pam Gray, the Women's Captain, assisted by Elizabeth Handsaker (Vice Captain) presented the prizes.




