

Hi Fellow Golfers! After having to bunker down for several weeks, it's great to be able to get back out on the course again.

Since February we have had 41 new members sign up, a positive sign for the club and it obviously shows we are a club that offers value for money and a great course to go with it.

Starting on Sunday 10th May, the weekly competition will recommence.

Full details of how to enter are on the web site.

The Management Committee, after closing the course as a precaution for several weeks, first opened the course to members, but only on a social basis with only pairs allowed, before increasing this to threes, resuming competitions and opening up to the public.

Following discussion with SAPOL, the committee has determined that we may sell soft drinks, water and other non alcoholic beverages to members and guests.
