Out and About

13th September – Murray Bridge -Stableford

Leonore, Cil, Janet, Anne, Wendy, Beatrice and Minnie competed in this competition. The course looked green and lush, but there was a lot of roll on the fairways and the greens were very fast. We had a couple of showers and thanks to the lying water were accompanied by the whine of mozzies. We were fortunate to be playing this week though, a week earlier the game would have been cancelled. The winds which had seen play at Echunga cancelled on 5 September created havoc at Murray Bridge. There had been a massive clean-up to prepare for this Open Day with many trees blown over and many more heavily pruned. Extra credit was certainly due to the groundsmen. Fourteen clubs were represented on the day with the field dominated by the red jumpers of the Tee Tree Gully contingent – a group of 25 who had travelled down by bus. 34 won the day in A grade; 38 in B grade, with Bernie Gatehouse (a former

Echunga player) second with 35; the C grade winner scored 41. Janet was our heroine: she won the Veteran's prize with 37 and also won a nearest the pin. Anne's playing partner from Victor Harbor who had just returned to playing after a ten year break from golf, celebrated by scoring a hole in one! Anne then won first prize in the raffle.

14th September – Flagstaff Hill

Val, Sharon and I played in this three ball better ball competition. Twenty groups representing six clubs played under leaden skies. The fairways had plenty of roll and we all managed to land safely over the water on the 7th, but it was a day of struggling golf with very few easy putts and very little magic. The company though was great and it was good to be out playing golf.

The results for some groups were very good with 50 being the winning score followed by forty-seven. Sadly we just missed out on the generous ball run down. There was a massive raffle and we were lucky here.

21st September – Lake Albert SSG Closed Championships A and B grades stroke

What a difference the weather makes! As we trekked down to Lake Albert again, our spirits were high as we drove (amidst the Crows supporters) in beautiful sunny weather.

Janeen and Val in A grade, played off the first while Pat U, Sue T and I in B grade played off the tenth. With fresh memories of our last game here in rain, wind and hail, we were stunned by the beauty of the day, shed layers of clothing, applied sun cream and insect repellent to try and hold the voracious mosquitoes at bay.

Everyone bar me started steadily. I was advised to take not one but two provisional balls off the tenth as I had hooked the balls so much they appeared to be out of bounds. To my huge relief, I found the first ball (we never found the second!) and it was well in!

The course was in great condition having also hosted the SA Country Juniors' Competition the previous weekend: it has certainly been a massive year of golf for the club. There was roll on the fairways though it seemed to be more sideways than forward. The greens were again very tricky: nothing held and a snail's pace was all that was needed to reach the hole.

We were treated to spectacular aerobatic formation flying by several groups of about fifty pelicans enjoying the thermals. The areas just off the fairway were quite clear and the main hindrance to finding wayward balls was Cape daisies. (playing partner from Strath) had a ball disappear completely but after much searching it was discovered in a thick dead branch about 4 metres up a tree. She managed to retrieve it through female wiles and her golf cart!

At the end of the day the A grade winner was Jenny Butcher (South Lakes) with a fantastic 69 gross; the net winner was Chris Bock (Mt Barker Hahndorf) with 72 (countback). In B grade Laine Flack (Willunga) won with 100 gross (with a three way countback); the net winner was Wendy Jackson (Echunga) with 75 (countback).

26th September She Oak Trophy at Strathalbyn

President Jo welcomed us and explained that the club had called in all favours from friends, family, even passing strangers so that they could field a team!!

Everyone who had played pennants here earlier in the year stressed that the course was in much better condition now and congratulated the club on the improvement. The levelling factor on this day was not the water, the fairways or the greens but the WIND! Those who could consistently keep the ball low had a great game; those who hit beautiful high balls watched in horror as the balls landed on trees or wafted off over the treetops and were ready to throw in the towel half way round.

As we ate our lunch in wind blasted exhaustion, we were amazed at the amount of lost property several club covers, a marker, sunglasses, even a lipstick were reunited with their owners! Then Strath declared that they needed a new coach and a revitalised player list and refused to divulge their score; Echunga with a team of 17 came second with an average of 27, but were beaten by Tailem Bend with 29.

each other, but oh, the bodies were so tired after their battering the day before!!

We were happy to return to the clubhouse, make our purchases at the trading table and golf fashion table (look out for Janet's beautiful new shorts), and listen to the sponsor's talk on travel in Europe and Africa. There was a field of 93 representing 9 clubs. The winning scores were A grade: 32; B grade: 38 and C grade: 39. For once there was a definite trend in the results as all the prizes (except for those specifically for visitors) were won by West Lakes or ex West Lakes players!

4th October – the Vines – Canadian Foursomes

Lisa, Ann M and I played in this competition. It was a beautiful day – almost too hot for a change and we welcomed every breath of cooling breeze. The course was in great condition with only the sanded greens causing some difficulty. Fourteen clubs were represented in the field of eighty-eight. We played reasonably well but not enough to challenge the winners. In Div 1 (0-21) 66 was the winning total and Div 2 (23-45) was won with a spectacular 64 by a pair from Willunga.
