## From the President

#### **New Green**

The 15th is much closer to being ready for play. The surrounds and the green look to be in very good condition, but the fairway is still a bit patchy. Michael is on holidays for this week and updates from John suggest that it could be ready in a couple of weeks. No firm date can be given yet.

#### **Junior Pennants**

Have been played over the last five weeks and Echunga fielded teams in two Divisions, the A1 and B2 grades. Due to unavoidable absences over three of the four weeks we have not had full teams every week. The players however acquitted themselves extremely well and the Southern Golf Group with Steve Hayes as Coordinator has managed to lift the profile of Junior golf quite significantly over the last three years so that it is now a very healthy competition.

#### **Survey Summary**

Survey responses are in and collectively they make a very interesting set of opinions from which we can draw some directions. I have prepared a summary for committee consideration as we begin this planning period over the next couple of months toward our 2012/13 budget.

#### Sponsor Update.

We are well into the process of confirming Sponsors both existing and new for 2012/13.

Paul Freer has confirmed his interest in sponsoring the club through a mixture of cash and products and targeted toward the Development Academy.

Birkenstock in the Hills have changed hands and will not be continuing their sponsorship at this stage. We have thanked them for their support and kept the option open for them to take it up again at another time.

Mike Williams has added a weekly \$50 gift voucher for NTP on the 2nd with his Hills Hire arrangement.

Others to extend their sponsorship at this stage are Neutrog, Bowden Print, Mad Aussie Signs and Dynamic Paint N Panel, Peak Fresh and Coopers Rural.

We have several new sponsors interested and negotiations with them are continuing, but we are always open to recommendations of new businesses that can be approached to join our sponsorship list.

#### Council

Whilst the Mt Barker Council at their council meeting approved the lease agreement for the Golf Course they had made several amendments to the original draft. These changes are still being discussed between both parties.

#### **CCTV**

Danny Willgoose has been very busy installing the new CCTV system. It will be a system that covers both inside and outside of the clubhouse with extra security for our Bar Staff and monitoring screens in both the Office and Canteen areas.

#### **Seniors Card promotion**

This promotion is proving to be very useful in promoting the club. We are keeping a good data base of Seniors taking up the option and it seems to be gathering momentum. The number of players from outside the club, during the week is increasing and many are becoming repeat green fee players and a number have elected to join.

#### Focus groups

I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Eric March and the willingness of members to be involved in the different focus groups that are being drawn together. The idea is to gather informed ideas, discuss and provide some guidance to Committee in a range of areas. It also draws on the expertise and energy within the club.

#### **Vice Captain Resignation**

Ben Slack has tendered his resignation as Vice Captain. Ben feels he is unable to give the time and attention to his current role within the club as the responsibility to his family has to be a priority. The Committee is looking at options to fill this vacancy.

#### **Out and About**

#### Flagstaff Hill (March 15<sup>th</sup>)


