



Course Superintendents Report

The State has recently experienced a heat wave with our golf course being no exception. Temperatures recorded at Echunga in series where 41, 42.2, 46.7, 44.8, 43.2 during the week. Watering was increased through the week to minimise the heat damage to fairways and greens. Full watering will continue on the fairways until the Autumn Classic, after this the watering on fairways will be cut back again to ensure the water supply holds out to the end of the season.



The turf wasn't the only thing to suffer the heat. Many of the native animals that now call the course home suffered badly as well. Possums and Koala's where dropping out of the trees all over.



This Koala tried his best to beat the heat by getting as low to the ground as possible. He was later found dead in the creek between water hazards, he must have tried to keep cool in the water but it wasn't enough. Ground staff offered cold water to as many of the little critters as they could find such as this Ringtail possum. In fact it was these little soles that suffered the most with Ringtail Possums being found all over the course in various states of decline. It was interesting to note that no Brush tail Possums where found suffering. Small Wrens also suffered with some found dead on the fairways in the afternoon.



An Explanation for a Common Word

Manure... An interesting fact.

In the 16th and 17th centuries, everything for export had to be transported by ship. It was also before the invention of commercial fertilizers, so large shipments of manure were quite common.


Thus evolved the term 'S.H.I.T', (Stow High In Transit) which has come down through the centuries and is in use to this very day.

RCGA Changes in Golf Rules for Senior Golfers Aged 55+

Rule 1.a.5

A ball sliced or hooked into the Rough shall be lifted and placed on the Fairway at a point equal to the distance it carried or rolled into the Rough with no penalty. The senior player should **not** be penalized for tall grass which ground keepers failed to mow.

Rule 2.d.6 (B)

A ball hitting a tree shall be deemed NOT to have hit the tree. This is simply bad luck and luck has no place in a scientific game. The senior player must estimate the distance the ball would have travelled if it **had not hit** the tree, and play the ball from there.

Rule 3.B.3(G)

There shall be no such thing as a lost ball. The missing ball is on or near the course, and will eventually be found and pocketed by someone else, thereby making it a stolen ball. The senior player is not to compound the felony by charging himself with a penalty.

Rule 4.C.7(H)

If a putt passes over a hole without dropping, it is deemed to have dropped. The Law of Gravity supersedes the Rules of Golf.

Rule 5.

Putts that stop close enough to the cup that they could be blown in, may be blown in. This does however not apply to balls more than three inches from the Hole. No one wants to make a mockery of the game.

Rule 6.a.9(K)

There is no penalty for so-called "out of bounds." If penny-pinching golf course owners bought sufficient land, this would not occur. The senior player deserves an apology, not a penalty.

Rule 7..G.15(Z)

There is no penalty for a ball in a water hazard, as golf balls should float. Senior players should not be penalized for any shortcomings of the manufacturers.

Rule 8.K.9(S)

Advertisements claim that golf scores can be improved by purchasing new golf equipment. Since this is financially impractical for many senior players, one-half stroke per hole may be subtracted for using old equipment.

Please advise all your senior friends of these important rule changes and keep multiple copies in your golf bag. Those not following the rules need to be provided a copy.

Golf is a game of integrity.
