



Member Profile

Whilst reading the February issue of the Putter, I noticed amongst the birthdays Mal Davis who had turned 90 on the 4th. Now I recall playing with Mal in a Thursday Comp back in the Summer of 2005 and on that day, he shot an 81 off the stick with a handicap of 21 and guess what? That's how old he was. Now I thought that was pretty unique although I was aware that Bradman had done it on several occasions at Kooyonga.

But that was Bradman!

I did not give it much more though until I read that he had turned 90. (Mal not Bradman). Upon further delving I came up with some interesting facts –

Mal was born in Melbourne in 1924. Three years later he moved with his parents to S.A. when his father was appointed manager of the Waratah Gypsum Co. at Stenhouse Bay and later at Marion Bay. Mal grew up in that area until at the age of 13, he began schooling at Scotch College.

Whilst at Scotch he became a junior member at the Glenelg G.C. and played off a handicap of 24.

He left Scotch 3 years later and joined the then prestigious firm of that time, Adelaide Steamship Co. (so did I but 16 years later) When he turned 18 Mal enlisted in the R.A.N. and served until the end of World War 2. He rejoined Adel Steam and was then transferred to the Melbourne office of that Company.

He eventually became the Melbourne manager but resigned in 1961 (so did I – must have been something <u>not</u> in the water – boats). He then joined the Australian National Line and continued to work with them until his retirement in 1982.

Mal had not played golf for 40 years when he joined the now defunct Carlogie G.C. in Victoria and reduced his handicap to 9.

He relocated to Aldgate S.A. in 1995 and joined the then Mt lofty G.C. that year.

In 1997 off a handicap of 10, Mal had a 73 off the stick – his age. Mal then joined the Hahndorf G.C. and in 2003, he had – you guessed it, a 79 off the stick.

Just prior to Hahndorf's closure, Mal joined Echunga in 2004. It was on that day in 2005 that Mal had the 81 whilst playing with me. He only plays in the Thursday Comp as he has weekend commitments. He is a regular competitor and generally plays with John Thomas and Barry Sparrow. Those two gentlemen have assured me

that he has shot his age at least 3 times since playing in that group.

At the time of writing, Mal had just completed a Stableford round with the afore mentioned duo and he had a score of 36 point and his handicap – 21!!! Mal is the consummate gentleman who still enjoys a thirst quenching ale or two.

He assures me he is as fit as a fiddle (and he looks it). I'll back him to make the magic double and the big guess is – what will his handicap be?


