Out and About

Metro Week 13th -15th October

Tea Tree Gully, The Grange (east), Mt Osmond

This was a gruelling three day competition with difficult conditions. We had wind, some rain and extremely cold conditions and this was reflected in many high scores. The first two days were stroke competitions. Tea Tree Gully course always needs accurate drives to minimize the sideways roll - few players scored below 80 net and many were above 90. Both courses had vast numbers of bunkers and were the downfall of many players. One player had the dubious honour of scoring 22 on one hole! The weather was marginally better on the Tuesday but

many players complained of the difficulty of locating the next tee – a problem our players have experienced in the past. The three day event concluded with Foursomes at Mount Osmond, again the scores were higher than usual. In the individual games, Naracoorte and Tea Tree Gully players won the gross and a Willunga player won the nett. Deb Christie from Lameroo won the Champion of Champions. Pairs from Lucindale and from Mt Osmond won the foursomes. (There was a salutary reminder that it is the players' responsibility to put their handicap on the card when several pairs were disqualified from the Foursomes event.) The Britten-Jones Cup (highest Country nett over two days) was awarded to a SWGG team from Murray Bridge, Echunga and Willunga.

Highercombe 31st October Stableford

Janeen, Sue T and I arrived at Highercombe to be greeted by a coven of witches, vampires, bats and other Halloween ghouls. The start was delayed as we waited for a couple of players who had the incorrect start time!

We played in fours and were amazed by one of our group who managed to play well while wearing a devil's outfit with horns and tail, black tights and a ballet tutu-style red outfit!! What Is A Water Hazard?

A "water hazard" is any sea, lake, pond, river, ditch, surface drainage ditch or other open water course (whether or not containing water) and anything of a similar nature on the *course*. All ground and water within the margin of a water hazard are part of the water hazard.

When the margin of a water hazard is defined by stakes, the stakes are inside the water hazard, and the margin of the hazard is defined by the nearest outside points of the stakes at ground level. When both stakes and lines are used to indicate a water hazard, the stakes identify the hazard and the lines define the hazard margin. When the margin of a water hazard is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is in the water hazard. The margin of a water hazard extends vertically upwards and downwards.

A ball is in a *water hazard* when it lies in or any part of it touches the *water hazard*.

Stakes used to define the margin of or identify a water hazard are obstructions.

Note 1: Stakes or lines used to define the margin of or identify a *water hazard* must be **YELLOW**.

Note 2: The *Committee* may make a Local Rule prohibiting play from an environmentally-sensitive area defined as a *water hazard*.

Lateral Water Hazard

A "lateral water hazard" is a water hazard or that part of a water hazard so situated that it is not possible, or is deemed by the Committee to be impracticable, to drop a ball behind the water hazard in accordance with Rule 26-Ib. All ground and water within the margin of a lateral water hazard are part of the lateral water hazard.

When the margin of a *lateral water hazard* is defined by stakes, the stakes are inside the *lateral water hazard*, and the margin of the *hazard* is defined by the nearest outside points of the stakes at ground level. When both stakes and lines are used to indicate a *lateral water hazard*, the stakes identify the *hazard* and the lines define the *hazard* margin. When the margin of a *lateral water hazard* is defined by a line on the ground, the line itself is in the *lateral water hazard*. The margin of a *lateral water hazard* extends vertically upwards and downwards.

Definitions

A ball is in a *lateral water hazard* when it lies in or any part of it touches the *lateral water hazard*.

Stakes used to define the margin of or identify a *lateral water hazard* are *obstructions*.

Note 1: That part of a *water hazard* to be played as a *lateral water hazard* must be distinctively marked. Stakes or lines used to define the margin of or identify a *lateral water hazard* must be **RED**.

Note 2: The *Committee* may make a Local Rule prohibiting play from an environmentally-sensitive area defined as a *lateral water hazard*.

Note 3: The *Committee* may define a *lateral water hazard* as a *water hazard*.


Water Hazards (Rule 26)

If your ball is in a Water Hazard (YELLOW STAKES AND/OR LINES) you may play the ball as it lies or, under penalty of one stroke:

- Play a ball from where your last shot was played, or
- Drop a ball any distance behind the water hazard keeping a straight line between the hole, the point where the ball last crossed the margin of the water hazard and the spot on which the ball is dropped.

If your ball is in a Lateral Water Hazard (RED STAKES AND/OR LINES), in addition to the options for a ball in a water hazard (see above), under penalty of one stroke, you may drop within two club-lengths of, and not nearer the hole than:

- The point where the ball last crossed the margin of the hazard, or
- A point on the opposite side of the hazard equidistant to the hole from the point where the ball last crossed the margin.



Ball played from teeing ground at point A comes to rest in a lateral water hazard (RED STAKES AND/OR LINES) at Point B having last crossed the margin of the hazard at Point C.

Player's options are as follows:

- Play ball as it lies at Point B, or under penalty of one stroke:
 - Play another ball from the teeing ground.
 - Drop a ball behind the hazard anywhere on the broken line from Point D backwards.
 - Drop a ball in the shaded area at Point C (i.e. within two club lengths of Point C not nearer the hole than Point C), or
 - Drop a ball in the shaded area at Point E. (i.e. within two club lengths of Point E but not nearer to the hole than Point E).


Eric was able to make a good putt on the 37th hole to win the match.

Rules of Golf

Finding Nearest Point of Relief.

- Through the green. Taking the stance that would have been taken and using the club that would have been used, if the problem area had not existed, the player should swing the club, and determine the nearest point, (no nearer the hole and not in a hazard or on a putting green), from where could ball be struck interference to swing or stance by the problem area. The point where the ball would lie in that swing is the nearest point of relief, and the one club length measurement can be measured from that point with any club, usually the driver.
- Wrong green. Same as "through the green", excepting, stance is not required to be off the green.

Measuring Relief Dropping Area.

- One and two club length drops can be measured with the club of choice.
- One club length measures are taken from the "nearest point of relief"
- Two club lengths measures from the problem point itself.
