The final of the 2016 Handicap Matchplay Final was played on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> May between Rob Eibisch and Bob Jackson with both players agreeing to hold the final on a Thursday.

It was a nervous start from Rob, making some early mistakes to lose the first hole to a fine up and down from Jacko. More good putting on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, followed by dropping a bomb from off the front of the green on the 4<sup>th</sup> had Jacko 2 up early, however, wins to Rob on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> had the lead quickly pegged back.

However, from this point on it was all Jacko. Producing a master class in course management and lag putting, Jacko quickly gained back the lead on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> to take a 2 up advantage into the back nine where he continued to tighten the screws. With his lag putting still being a highlight and his consistent fades off the tee block being as safe as houses, Jacko won the 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> whilst halves were had on the 11<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>, moving him to dormie 4.

Rob couldn't buy a hole, even when he got into a good position, as his short game let Jacko back into many holes. However, with the match all but sewn up it was Jacko's lag putting that let him down on the 15<sup>th</sup> and when his third found the water on 16. Rob had won consecutive holes and the lead was back to 2.

Both players had good tee shots, Rob just short right and Jacko just short left of the 17<sup>th</sup> green. With Rob chipping first he could only muster a shot into the heart of the green, still 15 feet from the back left pin. Despite losing the last two holes Jacko showed no sign of nerves, hitting a sublime chip up to 2 feet from the hole and when Rob's par putt sailed by, a concession was given making Bob Jackson our 2016 Handicap Matchplay Champion, winning 3/1.



We had a modified course from the 150 markers (where applicable) on the front 9 of the course. The game was Stableford (none of the kids had a handicap), so we picked up after 9 strokes. Between myself, Jamie, Allan and Mike, we managed to get the kids back in about 2 hours. We were super impressed with their attitudes and by the end of a long day they were showing some really good form. The kids enjoyed themselves so much, they begged me to open the practice cages so they could have a hit after they finished the game. We thank the groundsmen for their support and thank the patience of the other golfers on the day.

The 4 qualifiers from our District will play at the Primary Schools Golf State Championships at Adelaide Shores Golf Park on 1st and 2nd of September. The winner of the day was Mitchell Zander (Y5, St Michaels) with 53 points (he got high fives when he chipped in on the 3rd and his last two drives were fantastic). Second was Jesse Gallagher (Y5, St Michael's) with 60 points and Josh Liebelt (Y6, St Michael's) was third with 61 points. Esther Eckermann (Y6, St Michael's) made it through as fourth qualifier with 69 points (as there is a requirement to have 20% qualifiers to be girls as a way to encourage girls into the sport). Seb Zadow (Y7, Lobethal PS) and Hubba Matthews (Y7, Macclesfield) both had 62 points and were named as reserves. We wish them good luck and hope they practice their short game!

5 of the kids who attended also have been to our junior clinics and from parent feedback we are likely to have a few more join in. This is the first time we have hosted the event and it has given us quiet a few ideas about how we can improve what we do with junior development including purchasing some practice aids and providing mentoring games on the weekend. We look forward to holding the event again next year.

# From the Committee

#### **Carts**

#### 8/6/201

Unfortunately due to the recent rains the general committee, in line with recommendations from our ground staff, have had to decide that carts are no longer to be used on the course by green fee players or members until further notice.

The latest details will be continually updated on the website.

#### 15th Hole - New Out Of Bounds

A new culvert near the first green which has been cut underneath Dolman Road by the council, has resulted in the need for the club to place a new drain for this water down the side of the fence line on the 15<sup>th</sup> hole. Members would have seen this new drain over the last few months, which in the

interim period has been marked as ground under repair.

After considering the various options the Match Committee have decided to move the out of bounds fence in slightly, so that the new drain is OUT OF BOUNDS. This will be marked by white posts and a white string line, matching most other out of bounds fences on the course. There is also out of bounds signage at this area. A diagram of the new markings is provided below.

The Match Committee made this decision based on trying to ensure the simplest and clearest solution is found. If the area is left as a drain, relief would often need to be taken between the old out of bounds fence and the new drain by a right handed golfer, making this very awkward for the player. Whilst marking this area as out of bounds will slightly narrow the hole, the match committee believes that the area lost is both (a) minor and (b) sufficiently off the playing line to have minimal impact on anything, but a poor tee shot.

However as this area is now marked as out of bounds, players are asked that should their ball be heading into this area they should hit a provisional ball off the tee if they are unsure if their ball is in bounds or not.

# **Competitions - Unsigned Cards**

Competitions Rules – Disqualification when score card is unsigned.

Over the last few months we have had a number of issues around members being disqualified from the competition for not signing their score card. The basis for why disqualification occurs, the treatment for handicapping purposes and our process behind disqualification for this error is outlined below:

#### Rules:

The relevant Rules and Decisions are outlined below. For full details refer to the Rules of Golf and Decisions on the Rules of Golf books.

- Rule 6-6b: The player must ensure their marker has signed the card and then sign the card themselves.
- Rule 6-6c: Alterations to the card are not allowed once the card has been returned.
- Decision 6-6c/1: Defines when a card is considered to be returned.

#### Handicapping:

We handicap these cards as per the guidelines contained in the "GA Handicap System" booklet available from the Golf Australia website.

As per Section 10 (iv) Golf Australia recommend the score should still be counted for handicap purposes. As such the score will count as per normal, with the only variation being that the online Golflink score will be shown with a red box around it, which represents being "disqualified with a score."

#### **Our Process:**

- Any player not signing their scorecard will be disqualified (Rule 6-6b).
- Alterations to the card are not allowed once it has been returned (Rule 6-6c).
- A card is considered returned as soon as it is placed in the box (Decision 6-6c/1).
- Any player being disqualified under these Rules and Decisions will be ineligible to win any competition prize with that score.

Although Decision 6-6c/1 does have an option which states that if a player remains within the scoring area they can make alterations to the card

we use the second option within this decision which does not provide this ability to the player as we feel this is the fairest option for all players.

Generally unsigned cards are not found until the cards are sorted at the end of the day and as such anyone who plays later in the day and may still be in the clubroom when the error is found should not be able to alter their card after play as anyone who plays earlier in the day, and is not in the clubroom when cards are being checked, is not afforded this luxury.
